Please pray for the 20 part-time students taking classes at IBC this semester.


Fourteen of these students are attending class remotely from five different states.

#### A Gift From Your IRA





### IBC Work Teams: A Summer of Service

This past summer, Indian Bible College had the privilege of hosting 11 work teams from Oregon, California, Arizona, Colorado, Massachusetts, Texas, and Virginia. Their contributions reflect the very heart of Christian service, as described in Ephesians 2:10, "For we are God's handiwork, created in Christ Jesus to do good works..." These teams exemplified what it means to step into those good works by serving with joy, diligence, and a sense of purpose.

### Key projects completed over the summer included:

- **Staff Center Roof Project:** The staff center roof has long been in need of replacement. A work team undertook this significant roof renovation, adding much-needed protection for this important space.
- **Resort Pergola:** A beautiful pergola was constructed at the Resort (men's dorm), adding an inviting outdoor area that encourages community gathering, reflection, and relaxation. This space will serve students, staff, and guests for years to come.
- **Painting Projects:** Several areas of the campus inside and out were refreshed with new paint, adding vibrancy and life to our buildings.
- **Sound Mitigation:** To improve the learning environment, teams worked on soundproofing both the Academic Dean's office and the music room, ensuring quieter, more focused spaces for study, conversation, and music practice.
- **New Carpet in Dorms:** Multiple dorm rooms received new carpeting, enhancing the comfort and appeal of student living areas.
- **New Shelving at the Barn:** New shelving was built and installed in the Barn (administration building), greatly improving the organization and functionality of the front office area

Another milestone from this summer was the culmination of a **two-year-long process of getting approved plans for the on-campus fitness center**. This fitness center has been a long-standing dream, designed to support the physical
